

Subterrene - casey neill & the norway rats incident recordings - 2018

I debated whether or not Casey Neill & the Norway Rats were folk enough for the Mad Folk Newsletter. Eventually I did what any good reviewer would do; I looked Neill up on Wikipedia. There it was-"genre: folk-punk." And that was good enough for me, especially since I haven't been able to listen to anything else since I picked up the CD at SXSW, where he had it a week ahead of the release date. Neill's earlier work, going all the way back to the rollicking, Pogues-channeling 1995 release RiffRaff (whose title track's chorus "Hurray for the Riff Raff!" had to be the inspiration for the band of the same name), leaned heavily on Celtic music as well as folk and punk, but Subterrene finds him moving on. From the sweeping orchestral beauty of opening track "My Beloved Accomplice" to the trippy techno flourishes of the immortal closer "Deathless," the record is instantly memorable, immediately likeable, and immensely satisfying. Neill doesn't do it on his own, his band is an important part of what makes these songs work. Norway rat is another name for the brown or sewer rat, but these musicians are anything but common. They include drummer Joe Mengis, bassist Jesse Emerson, Jenny Conlee Drizos of the Decemberists on keyboards, and Chet Lyster of the Eels on quitar.

On first listen, two tracks immediately stand out. The first of these is the addictive "Savages," a master's class in tunesmithery, an intoxicating elixir of swirling

melody, clever wordplay and perfect backing vocals. "In a railroad apartment in the summer heat, you were drunk, strung out on another guy, you tasted sweet, I died a little more, I died." It's hard to describe, but somehow like "Tainted Love" reborn in fascinating, heartbreaking fashion. The second is "In the Swim," featuring Scott McCaughey. It's McCaughey's backing vocals that elevate this song from excellent to transcendent, and it was surely this contribution that earned him a co-write credit alongside Neill and Lyster. Half the time he's echoing Neill, the other half he's having a conversation with him. "If I lose myself come find me," Neill sings in the chorus, "stop and listen" replies Mc-Caughey the first time, "my mission is clear," the next. Neill continues "And if I stray off course remind me." The answers come back, "of course I listen," and then later, "there's someone still here." It's been awhile since I've been that affected by a vocal pairing, I get serious shivers every time I hear it. (I should also mention that REM's Peter Buck lends his guitar stylings to the tune.)

The spell of those two songs is reason enough to check out Subterrene, but that's certainly not the only one. There's the desolate "Darken Down," which perfectly captures the hypnotic effect of late night driving on deserted highways. "I'm wide awake," he claims, "on the surface of the moon... I'm wide awake, on a two lane blacktop, can't drive fast enough." Cigarettes and Red Bull, manic DJs and brimstone broadcast preachers are all part of the trip. The unlikely, but also gorgeous and epic, "The Murderers Show Mercy" finds assassins turning over a new leaf. The equally haunted "Moving Through the Trees" asks repeatedly "was there ever a blood so red, as the blood on my right shoulder?" Though you never know if the blood is his or someone else's. The futuristic "Siphoners" paints a Mad Maxesque, post-apocalyptic scene which also feels oddly contemporary. Sigh, it's just all so good. Hopefully by next month I will have been able to put this CD aside long enough to listen to at least one other record, but I can't make any promises.
