Matt Watroba is the voice of folk music in Michigan for his work with WDET-Detroit Public Radio. As producer and host of the Folks Like Us program for over 22 years, and the nationally syndicated Sing Out! Radio Magazine, Watroba has a repertoire and presentation that is unique on stages across the country. Matt sings and writes songs of compassion, inner strength, humor, and every day living. He was awarded "Best Overall Folk Performer" by the Detroit Music Awards for the year 2000. He has shared the stage with some of our greatest performers, including Pete Seeger, Tom Paxton, Ramblin' Jack Elliott, Arlo Guthrie, Christine Lavin, Peter Yarrow, Richard Thompson, and Madison's own Lou and Peter Berryman.

Matt will perform a rousing couple of sets at a new folk venue: The Columbus Public Library Annex, located at 251 West James Street in Columbus, WI. The Annex is a lovely older home converted for public use by the library next door. The cozy living room serves as the stage and theater for what promises to be a fun night for all.

SONiA (Rutstein) disappear fear has 17 Award winning CDs including first round Grammy entries for several albums. "Her songs are a vivid celebration of the human spirit in all its infinite manifestations", Don Kening-Chicago Daily Herald, "her music has a singular sound that makes labeling and categorizing a waste of time."

SONiA is a world class composer and artist. She is the recipient of the Coin Of Honor from a joint coalition of United States military for her humanitarian efforts. She received the Spirit of Folk Music Award (2017) by Folk Alliance International. SONiA's latest double CD "LIVE at MAXiMAL" was in

the first round running Grammy for Folk Album of the Year. She is a featured artist (Hamburg 2018) for the VOICE PROJECT to free the imprisoned Nudem Durak who is jailed in Turkey for singing in Kurdish. This is also one of many projects SONiA embraces to live into the possibility that- when you disappear fear what you have is love.

From the Opera House in Sydney to the bomb shelters in the Middle East to the Kerrville Folk Festival, SO-NiA has shared the stages and studios with many of her heroes including Bruce Springsteen (Light of Day Benefit concert for Parkinson's disease) Pete Seeger, Joan Baez, Nickel Creek, Green Day, Emma Lou Harris, GEORGE, John Fullbright, Sheryl Crow, Jewel, Lucinda Williams, Joan Jett, and many more. Three summers ago we were roaming around on a lovely day during the Atwood Summer Festival. We paused to listen to a song by a band we had never seen before, and within five minutes we were hooked. The band was Listening Party, a trio of hip gentlemen from Milwaukee. That winter we invited them for a New Year's Eve concert at our home, and the audience response was dynamite.

The band consists of Weston Mueller on vocals and guitar, Joshua Hester on mandolin, bass and electric guitar, and Jacob Wood on piano, Wurlitzer, and even

a train whistle. The trio has released two CDs, including this year's Less Is More, and they tour frequently around the Midwest. They've performed at Summerfest and at the Olbrich Garden summer music series, and lots of other venues in Wisconsin. We keep a sharp eye out to see if they are headed our way to Madison.

Their sound combines alt-folk, Americana, bluegrass and a touch of soul, with a strong array of up-tempo tunes and beautiful ballads. Weston's powerful voice soars and glides on songs like The Rock and The One from their first self-titled CD that came out a few years ago. We play

it constantly here at our home. Their new CD is even better, with gems like Rocky Road, Train, Bones, and Ruthie combining to create an eclectic and dynamic album. The band was also nominated recently for a WAMI award in the American/Bluegrass category.


You can come in for the day and do not have to stay overnight to attend the event (but staying overnight better allows you jam on into the night and early morning!).

THE HIGH COST OF LIVING STRANGE - BEN DE LA COUR

FLOUR SACK CAPE RECORDS - 2018

Ben de la Cour's recent release The High Cost of Living Strange seems weightier than its thirty minute running time. It might have something to do with vividness of his imagery, the darkness of his self-proclaimed "americanoir" lyrics, or the seeming ease with which he crafts complicated tunes. Despite the fact that de la Cour has been on the road non-stop for much of the last couple years, there's a relative dearth of information about him. His web page lacks a standard bio, substituting pages of impressive praise from an array of sources. His Facebook page opts for a fictional approach, "Ben de la Cour is the offspring of US Poet Laureate Maxine Kumine and Groundskeeper Willie from the Simpsons. De la Cour was born a Virgo but transferred to Sagittarius after his Freshman year for more playing time." All I really know for sure is that he currently lives in Nashville, and that I am really looking forward to seeing him play.

Like any real folk record, its best track is a murder ballad, and one that could go up against any of Nick Cave's Murder Ballads and out-creep them all. Though no matter how many times I've listened to the haunting "Tupelo," I'm still not sure how it went down. The set-up is familiar, man picks up female hitchhiker who just wants to get as far away from her hometown as possible, "I asked her which way we should go, she said I don't care which way you point this thing, just get me out

of Tupelo." She thinks he's a nice guy, she's wrong, "I watched her eyes roll over white in the tangled seatbelt spider web and the blue green dashboard light." Next thing you know he's dumping her clothes behind a truck stop and heading back to Tupelo. If you think the song gives you the shivers; the video is even more unnearving. Compare that to the nostalgic, homespun charm of "Uncle Boudreaux Went to Texas," and you get an idea of the breadth of de la Cour's song-crafting skill. His gently plucked guitar and Jeff Lisenby's accordion provide a heartstring-pulling melody for the tale of a child regaled with the songs and stories of the Lone Star state by his uncle, who would "sing his way to Texas every night." Turns out, the truth is that "the closest Boudreaux ever got to Texas was Willie's Greatest Hits."

Jaunty opening track "Dixie Crystals" bounces along on a rhythmic snare and Cajun violin. It's pretty clear from the context clues ("don't feel nothing, don't feel no pain, got Dixie crystals running through my brain," and "got little girls lining up and givin' it away, all for a ride on the nothing train") that the crystals he's referring to are not the extra fine granulated sugar produced in Savannah since 1917. And it's an addictive ride, pun intended. "Company Town" takes a page from Springsteen's Nebraska, painting a picture of a town in decline, where poverty and suicide weighs heavy, and the last "dream is ground to dust beneath the heel of a rich man's boot." Its sing-along chorus belies its gloom. "Face Down Penny" is a back handed charmer, the metaphors clever and completely unexpected. Harmonica and mandolin back thought-provoking lines like "The thing about being a face down penny is you can't look back, can't worry about anything, every day looks the same, and it's enough to make a poor boy go insane." This is really good stuff, and I'm completely hooked. Time to see what else I can find out about him.
