

Dan Bern CD Release Concert on September 19th

Dan's songs range from topical to funny, often using iconic characters such as, Woody Guthrie, Bob

Dylan, Bruce Springsteen and Marilyn Monroe and many, many more. Dan Bern is a throwback to the

days of exemplary songs and extraordinary songwriters. He's one of the very best, and we sure could use more of his kind these days. His voice, to me, is a mix between Tom Petty and Bob Dylan. He has

always been defiantly uncompromising in his writing style. He is a singer, songwriter, a painter and a

writer and sometimes you get all of that tossed in to one song. He currently has over 2 dozen albums

released, everything from a children's record to a record of just baseball songs.

LOS ANGELES — August 6, 2019 Acclaimed singer-songwriter Dan Bern touring the United

States in support of his forthcoming album Regent Street. After losing two fingertips from an accident

with a snowblower in March 2018, Bern found himself unable to play guitar for nearly a year. Turning to

the piano, he found fresh perspective which led to Regent Street. A collection of eleven songs that reach

new artistic heights, Regent Street will be released Friday, September 13, just in time for his Madison

show. The title track and lead single was previously recorded by Roger Daltrey, a fan of Bern's work,

after Bern sent The Who singer a demo. "Regent Street" was recorded for this album in a style inspired by Daltrey's version, and Bern considers it a cover of his own song. Passionate, energetic and poignant,

Regent Street is a stand-out album in Bern's impressive discography.

While Bern may be best-known for his masterpieces "Jerusalem," "Marilyn," and "Tiger Woods," he has

released 25 albums and EPs, and

played thousands of shows across North America and Europe. He is a

live captivating performer with loyal, multi-generational following. Ani DiFranco, an early supporter of

Bern's, took him on tour with her and produced his second album, Fifty Eggs. Bern's songs have

appeared in numerous films and TV shows, and he has written original songs for the films Walk Hard —

The Dewey Cox Story and Get Him to the Greek, as well as the 15-song soundtrack for Everett Ruess,

Wilderness Song, a documentary produced by Jonathan Demme.

YEARS TO BURRN - CALEXICO & IRON & WINE SUB POP RECORDS - 2019

It would be impossible to talk about the new collaboration between Calexico and Iron & Wine, the appropriately titled Years to Burn, without mentioning exactly how many years have burned since their last partnership. Way back in 2005, Sam Beam, who records and tours under the Iron & Wine moniker, with just a couple LPs and a handful of EPs under his belt at the time, brought seven demos to Calexico's Joey Burns and John Convertino. They filled in the blanks, and the unexpectedly harmonious marriage of the two resulted in some of the best music of both bands' careers to that point. Fast forward to 2019, when the full album reunion they had talked about for years finally happened after a decade plus of guest spots. At 32 minutes, the LP Years to Burn only bests the EP Reins by five minutes and one track (unless you count the triptych of "Bitter Suite" as three), but this time around it feels more like an alliance, rather than a band looking for a way in to one songwriter's unique craft. Beam still holds the, ahem, reins, but Burns and the rest of the band make themselves heard. It's worth pointing out the longevity of these artists. Both have found larger audiences, as well as increasing critical acclaim, and this creative intersection finds them still on the way up.

The aforementioned eight-minute suite anchors the second half of record. It begins with the short Spanish language section "Pàjaro," sung by Calexico's Jacob Valenzuela, his soulful vocals a familiar part of their recent releases. It morphs into the wordless vocal and trumpet dance "Evil Eye," before dissolving into the gentle Beam lyric of "Tennessee Train." The title is more than a play on words, as comes to bear in the final line, "Trains leave Tennessee, moaning as they roll away, roll

see, moaning as they roll away, roll away, roll away. Life is bittersweet." A quick blast into Google translate reveals that Valenzuala's "Ese pájaro muerto quiere alas pero no lo recuerda," is deciphered by Beam as "This dead bird wants the wings he can't recall." On the other end of the spectrum is the sub two minute intermission "Outside El Paso," a spare and haunting mélange of cymbal, tom, and fluttering trumpets, as empty as the desert of West Texas. The title track is a gentle lullaby, imbued with images of nature, hypnotized by Burns' backing vocals. The repeated line, "Our tears hold the light in our eyes," is one of those beautifully cryptic Beam lines. Tears of sadness? Joy? Only he knows for sure.

Appropriately, Convertino kicks off this record with an emphatic count on the kit, and opening track "What Heaven's Left," flush with trumpet and lovely harmonies, sets the mood and the bar. The two highlights here are the Traveling Wilbury-esque closing track "In Your Own Time," and the glorious "Father Mountain." The former swells with the obvious camaraderie of the musicians, reflected in Burns and Beam's affirmation lyrics, "Cause we only want a life that's well worth living. And sleeping ain't no kind of life at all. Come meet the family and get warm by the fire, someone will catch you if you want to fall," and echoed in Rob Burger's melodious piano. The singalong immediacy of "Father Mountain" belies an ultimately melancholy denouement, "We read the writing on the wall, braced each other for the fall. There's only one way off the mountain after all." I would love to be part of an audience hearing these songs played live. Sadly, the closest they get is Grand Rapids, MI. Anyone fancy a road trip?
