Chad Elliott is about to grace the MadFolk stage! I have had the honor of watching Chad play over the years, sometimes at a festival, sometimes on a MadFolk Stage, often at Folk Alliance playing on many showcases to small rooms with a song circle covering Towns VanZandt songs. One of the most fun was when he won the Woody Guthrie Songwriting competition and was invited to play the Woody Guthrie Festival in Oklahoma... in July.... It was over 100 degrees and the people LOVED him. I never miss a chance to see him sing, and he never disappoints. For this show he is bringing with him Kathryn Fox, and they are touring these days as a new formed folk duo called Weary Ramblers. Now besides the great story-telling, Chad and Kathryn will be bringing their beautiful harmonies and a violin, and I am now more excited than ever.

# Siren Songs - trapper schoepp 2023 - grand phony music company

If one is looking for inspiration when recording a country folk record, it seems like Johnny Cash's cabin in Hendersonville TN would be pretty inspiring. For Siren Songs, his fifth Trapper Schoepp album, the Milwaukee singer/songwriter traveled to Tennessee with producers Pat Sansone (Wilco) and John Jackson (Jayhawks) to record a dozen new songs at The Cash Cabin Studio. Originally constructed as a sanctuary for the country legend and his family, it evolved into a recording destination. Now owned and managed by Johnny and June's son, John Carter Cash, the studio has seen a wealth of talent, from its original occupant who recorded parts of his last three American Recordings records there, to Loretta Lynn who used the studio to record over one hundred songs. Not only is the cabin rich in history, but it also has state of the art recording equipment and a treasure trove of instruments available for use, including June's 1889 Steinway piano.

The songs were recorded with all the musicians in the same room, and it feels more alive for it. Traveling with Schoepp was his brother Tanner on bass and blood harmony vocals, and guitarist Quinn Scharber. They were joined by drummer Jon Radford, multi-instrumentalist Tim Hoke and vocalist Sarah Peasall McGuffy. The record's producers also contributed. Sansone utilized the cabin's harmonium on "Good Graces," and the pump organ's haunting notes open the song. Hoke's tin whistle, McGuffy's ethereal vocals, and the slow marching beat conjure visions of a Hollywood ending, as the heroes come over the hill, sun streaming behind them, battered but not beaten. "There are two roads we may go down, someday, we may falter, we may rise up, we may rise up to greet the day." I hope he has someone placing his songs, because this one needs screen time.

A thread of green runs through the record, as Irish folk artists like the Clancy Brothers and Paul Brady prove as much an influence as the Cash legacy. Schoepp credits Brady for introducing him to the open D tuning, without which "this album probably wouldn't exist." It's hinted at in "Good Graces." but "Secrets of the Breeze" fueled by bodhran-style drumming, Jackson on mandolin, and more whistle, is a fullon sea shanty. Hoke's accordion gives "Eliza" its Guinness-hoisting, pubswaying soul, while lyrics like "Fare the well Eliza, I bid adieu," anchor it to a bygone era. The nimble love song "Anna Lee" layers finger-picked guitar and mandolin over propulsive percussion. Schoepp's whisper singing gives his words heartfelt poignancy, "I took the time to think about it, the more I think the less I doubt it. The more I look, the more I see that I still love you Anna Lee." It's the record's understated highlight.

Schoepp has shown his flair for historical story songs before. (If you haven't heard "The Ballad of Olaf Johnson," you are in need of a dive into his back catalog.) On "Maid of the Mist," he faithfully recounts the tale of Annie Edson Taylor, the first person to go over Niagara Falls in a barrel. Her wonderfully musical name makes for a rousing chorus on this piano-driven tune. There's another history lesson on the bluesy, funky "Devil's Kettle," as well as a bonus one in geography. Along Lake Superior's north shore, the Brule River splits over a rocky outcropping. One side continues along, the other half goes into a hole, and disappears. The latter has made for legends of gangsters disposing of bodies in it, "Storm's raging don't rock the boat, God won't answer and the bodies won't float." Sansone takes a seat at the studio's Hammond B<sub>3</sub> for a terrific solo.

Schoepp has made a series of extremely likeable albums, but Siren Songs is his best work to date. Perhaps some credit goes to the Cash Cabin Studio, but more likely it is Schoepp coming into his own as a songwriter. However, credit for the album's winning cover photo definitely goes to Joseph Cash, Johnny's grandson.




